Best Practice I

Title: Library Orientation Programmes

Objective:

The main objective of conducting a Library Orientation Programme every new academic session is to equip the new entrants with knowledge of the College Central library, its open-shelf facility, e-resources and the rules and regulations that govern proper functioning of this important campus resource.

Context:

“As we read so we produce”. The underlying principle of Library Orientation Programme (LOP) in GMGC is to make library use easy and effective for students at all course and difficulty levels and encourage them to become frequent library-goers and gain knowledge that can be applied.

Practice:

The College Library reflects the government initiatives in the field of higher education and its role in teaching, research and extension activities in HEIs and stresses that medium of information must not be restricted to print media alone. In GMGC, LOPs disseminate information about the library facilities including open-access shelves, the 5-user Libsys LSease software, now replaced with KOHA (22.11 version), computers for OPAC searching, display racks for latest informational resources, cheap reprographic facility and Book Bank facility. During covid lockdown, LOPs were conducted to guide teachers and students in accessing e-resources purchased with RUSA 2.0 grants. Sage Publications, Oxford University Press, Pearson Publications and McGraw Hill personnel conducted the sessions.

Outcome:

- Increased library footfalls and N-list (INFLIBNET) usage statistics. Records show 5293 physical footfalls in 2016-17, 5098 in 2017-18, 4599 in 2018-19, 3090 up to March 2020 and zero footfalls from 16th March 2020 to January 2022 (the lockdown period).
- Increased usage of OPAC to access e-resource sites such as Shodhganga, e-Shodhsindhu through the library website www.gmgclibrary.wordpress.com
- Records of National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for scholarly content indicate downloads of 901 pages of study material in 2016, 3243 pages in

2017 and 7035 pages in 2018 and 4228 pages in 2019. During lockdown, usage was impressive at 26616 pages of downloads by 392 students in 2020 and 17362 pages by 359 students in 2021.

- e-resource users have increased significantly from 11 users in 2019 to 393 users in 2020.
- Central Library Website blog statistics show 11418 visitors till January 2023.

Constraints

- Arranging LOPs without disrupting the classes is a challenge.
- Accommodating a large number of students eager to use the reading room and reprographic facility is difficult.
- Internet connectivity disruptions and affordability are major constraints.
- Provision of adequate computer access in peak hours is difficult..

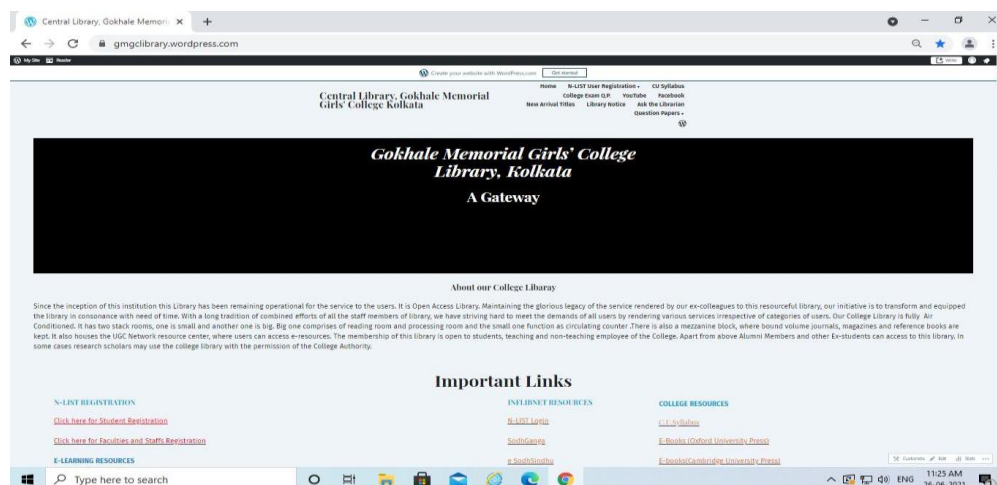

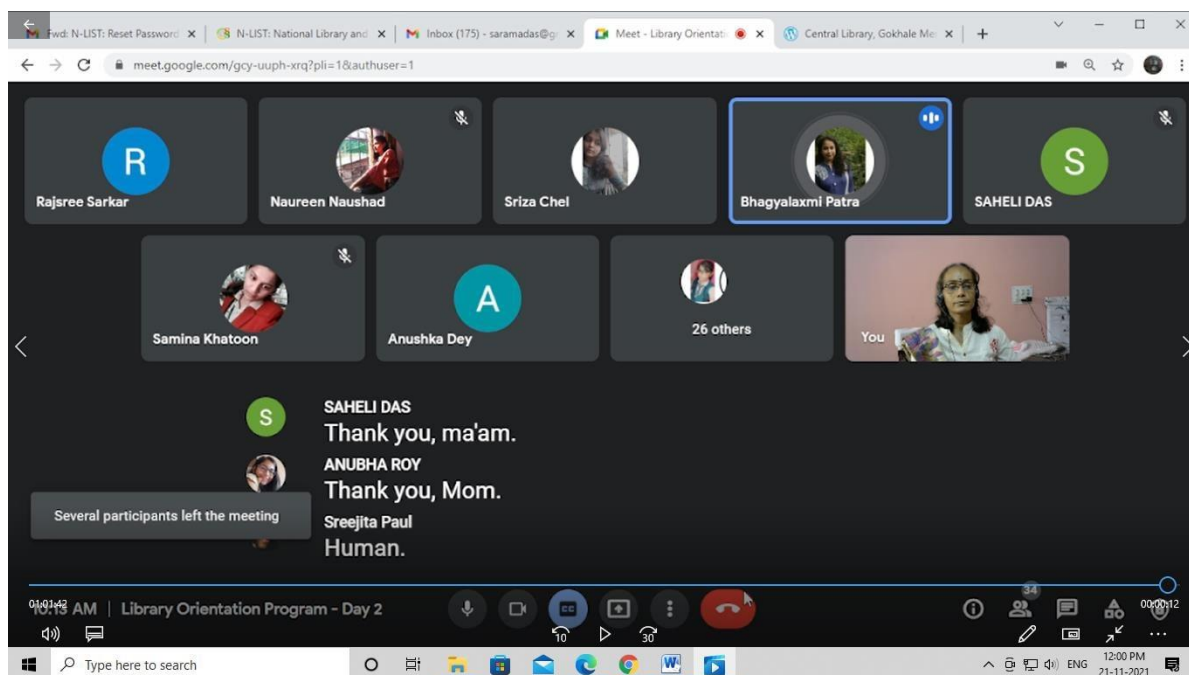
“Best User of E-resources Access of the N-List Programne” has been introduced to encourage usage of e-resources.

Subsequently a regular LOP was organized on 08/11/2021, 09/11/2021 and 12/11/2021 for the students of Semester 1.

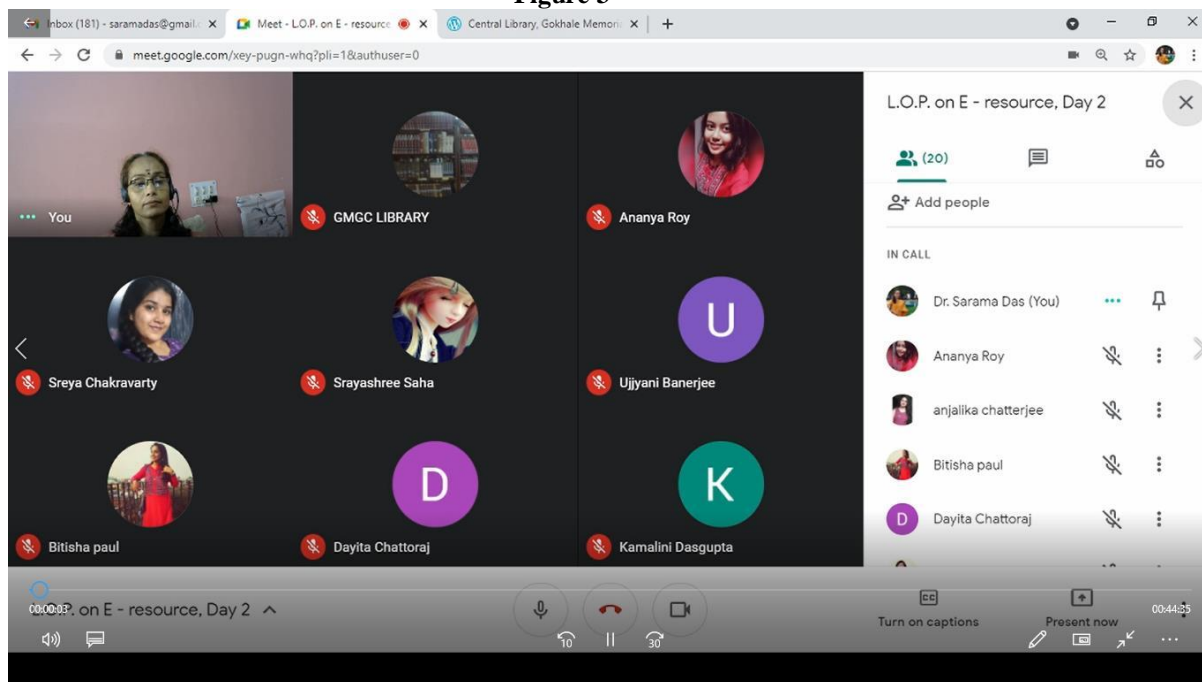

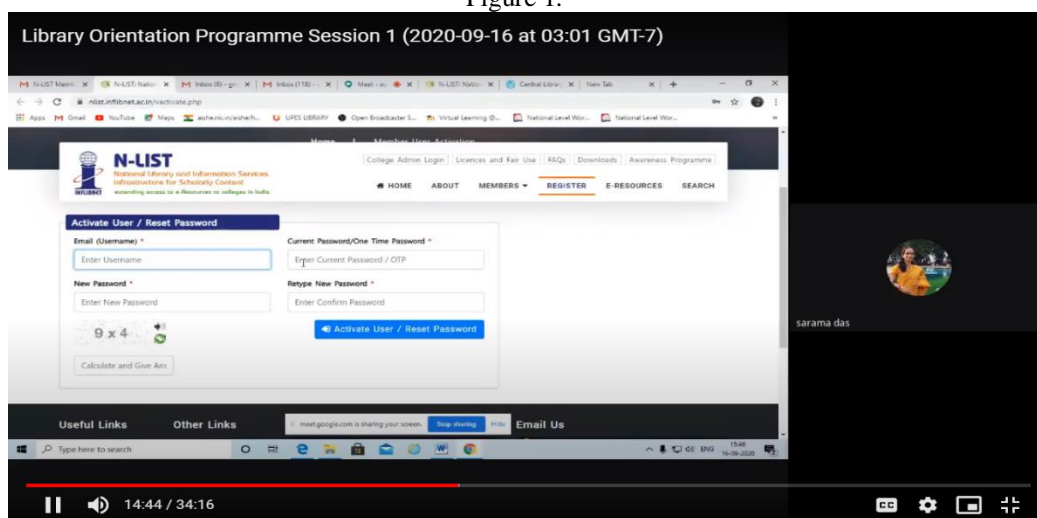
