Report of the Literary Club 2021-22

Till date the Club held four online meetings and numerous discussions which finally paved the way to a new publication of 'Monochrome', the literary supplement in December 2021. Student coordinators were selected, and after inviting suggestions from the student members, a rough draft was chalked out for a plan of activities for the Club for the year 2021- 2022 Weekly Book Reviews and Discussions to acquaint the students with the latest books, and authors was suggested to be carried out with each student member presenting a book review of recently read book.Subsequently, the Club decided to have random gatherings in
